
COVID-19

SAFETY MEASURES

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Youthreach offers a flexible and dynamic programme of integrated general education, vocational training and work experience for unemployed early school leavers aged 16-20 years. Students set personal and educational goals that help increase their self-esteem, skill and knowledge base and employability.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants need to be unemployed early school leavers i.e. not completing the Leaving Certificate and aged between 16 and 20 years. ETB approval is required for applicants aged 15 years.

DURATION

5 days per week for 2 years approx.

CERTIFICATION

We try to be as accommodating as possible to students of all educational levels and interests. To this end we offer a wide selection of subjects from levels 3 to 4 including:

New taster programmes are offered every year such as bricklaying, tiling, floor and carpet laying, beauty therapy, hairdressing.

FUNDING & TRAINING ALLOWANCE

The programme is funded by Kildare Wicklow ETB. Students who are aged 16 and over are eligible for a training allowance while attending the programme. Those who live outside Naas may also receive a travel allowance. Support with childcare may be available.

To support and promote healthy life choices and to provide an opportunity for everyone in the centre to achieve their full potential.




QQI AWARDS OFFERED
